

# TOWN OF HARTLAND MONTHLY MEETING

### CALL TO ORDER:

The monthly town board meeting of the Town of Hartland held on Tuesday, May 10, 2011 was called to order by the Town Chairman, Robert Woldt at 7:00 pm in the Town of Hartland town hall.

### MEETING NOTICES:

Chairman verified that proper postings had been done at the Shawano Leader, Town Hall, corners of N. Highline / Townline Road and S. Highline / E. Slab City Road. The Shawano Leader had again failed to post meeting notification.

### MINUTES:

Clerk read minutes from the April monthly meeting. Frank Heller made motion to approve minutes and Jay Teschke seconded.

### TREASURER'S REPORT:

#### Payment of Bills:

Jay Teschke made a motion to approve payment of accounts, check numbers 8493-8503 totaling \$13,380.38. Frank Heller seconded the motion, motion carried.

### ROADS

Bob reported that L.J. Sperberg chose to withdraw his bid for gravel for the West Townline Road project because he can no longer provide gravel at the previously bid cost due to current fuel prices. Frank made a motion, seconded by Jay, to go with Michel's bid at \$7.40/ton since they agreed to hold the price of their original bid from last fall.

Bob stated that we're still waiting for an estimate on continuing the road construction of Valley Road north from Meadow Lane to the intersection with Slab City Road.

Jay made a motion, seconded by Frank, to approve JENDA Trucking to install a turn-around at the south end of Moonlight Lane for winter snowplowing purposes. JENDA's bid was \$3275, Al's Excavating was \$3500.

### MISCELLANEOUS

Roy presented a letter from the Shawano Historical Society regarding a county-wide collaborative effort for a photo collection of the logging history of Shawano County.

Bob presented paperwork from Darlene Heller regarding a verbal agreement that summarily stated that she would create the Town of Hartland Sesquicentennial book in exchange for the proceeds of all book sales to be donated to the Shawano County Historical Society. Discussion was held on this issue with a final motion made by Jay and seconded by Frank to give the books to the SCHS to sell.

Bob received a letter from the DNR requesting information pertaining to whether the town had an ordinance regarding Oak Wilt in terms of moving firewood, tree trimming, etc. Bob stated he would reply that the town does not.

Discussion was then held over a letter from the Shawano County Sherriff's Department regarding proper placement of fire signs. Further discussion was then held over missing signs within the township.

Jay stated that Vick VandenBush had contacted him regarding the removal of the old "Miller Store" sign. Frank said that Allan Bontrager might have moved into the old store and should probably be contacted before the sign is removed. Jay will contact Bontrager and then follow up with VandenBush.

Date for Open Book was set for June 30<sup>th</sup> from 3-6pm and Board of Review on July 19<sup>th</sup> from 6-8pm.

Discussion was held over placement of a fill area on the shoulder of South Highline Road for the Methodist Church Cemetery. The church doesn't have enough funding to do it themselves. Since the church is tax exempt, any improvements made by the town would need to come out of taxpayer funds. Frank will contact Matt Marosek to have him get in touch with them to try to work something out for them on their expense.

Marlin gave a presentation on the Shawano County redistricting issue. A decision has been made to reduce the number of supervisory districts from 30 to 27. Janet Powers, town clerk for Angelica, asked Marlin if he could present a memorandum from the Town of Angelica Board regarding issues they have with the most current proposed map. The Town of Angelica Board is opposed to the current map because it severely limits their representation as compared to the originally proposed map. The Town of Hartland is similarly affected by losing representation to the Town of Washington. Decision was made that Roy would create an opposition memorandum similar to that of Angelica's that would support reverting back to the original plan as initially presented.

After no further business was presented, motion was made by Jay and seconded by Frank to adjourn. Meeting was adjourned at 8:15pm.
